China’s amazing Panjin Red Beach, located on the north coast of Liaodong Bay, belongs to anyone’s bucket list of natural wonders. Suaeda seepweeds add a certain otherworldly quality to the landscape. Though they might seem like dreadfully mindless monsters, octopuses are among Earth’s most fascinating creatures. Far more than just squishy eight-legged beasts that creep across the ocean floor looking for food, octopuses possess many interesting qualities and are much smarter than they appear.

Indeed, octopus intelligence is something scientists have been studying for many years. Octopuses are widely considered to be the most intelligent of all invertebrates. They are able to learn from experience and have excellent short- and long-term memories. They can solve complex problems, such as opening a jar while trapped inside it, and often think up interesting games to play when they are bored. Also of note is that each of an octopus’s eight arms has a mind of its own. For example, their arms can open clam shells while the octopus itself is busy searching a cave for more food. Their arms are also covered in powerful suckers which have the ability to taste whatever they are touching.

Another interesting fact about octopuses is that they have three hearts and blue blood. Their blood, which is copper- rather than iron-based, is more efficient at transporting oxygen when water temperatures drop. Perhaps even more interesting is that octopuses often crawl or walk along the ocean floor instead of swimming, which takes up far more energy.

If you’ve never seen an octopus in the wild, it may be due to their amazing camouflage abilities. Octopuses can change the color of

their skin to match their environment. If this doesn't keep them hidden from predators, they can also spray a toxic ink that blinds and confuse anyone that might pose a threat.
